



Gross International Human Rights and Humanitarian Law Violations in the Context of the Ongoing War on the Amhara

Executive Summary

The Amhara Association of America (AAA) has been monitoring the situation and investigating reported gross human rights and serious international humanitarian law violations in the context of the ongoing war on the Amhara people mainly by the Abiy regime forces known as the *Ethiopian National Defense Forces* (ENDF) and in some incidents by the *Oromo Liberation Army* (OLA) militants. AAA has interviewed tens of eyewitnesses, family members of victims and survivors to get first-hand information as well as examining reports of media and both local and international human rights organizations to get secondary data. **Our investigation reveals between August 3 and October 3, 2023, at least 807 civilians including women, children, elderly persons and a few *hors de combat* were killed, 634 more were injured and at least 3 women were raped and sexually assaulted in the Amhara Region and the neighboring Oromia Region in relation with the ongoing war on the Amhara in serious violation of**

international law. All recorded casualties occurred in the Amhara Region except 94 deaths and 9 injuries occurred in Dera Woreda, annexed into the Oromia Region though it is inhabited by ethnic Amhara residents. All the violations were perpetrated by the ENDF while 94 killings and 9 injuries were committed by OLA militants aiding the ENDF. The *Oromia Special Force* (OSF) was also responsible for 2 killings and 3 injuries. Most of the mass and extrajudicial killing and bodily injuries were committed while the victims were accused of supporting, hosting and being Fano fighters and hiding firearms. As part of the ongoing war on the Amhara, the regime forces mass arrested tens of thousands of ethnic Amhara citizens across the federal capital, Addis Ababa city and the Amhara Region and concentrated them in deplorable and harsh conditions in unacknowledged sites located in different parts of the country. Our investigations confirm several incidences of large-scale property pillaging and destruction in the Amhara Region and the annexed Dera Woreda by the ENDF, OSF and OLA militants. The government has shutdown both network and internet communications to hinder reporting about the ongoing violence. Government officials and their allies have continued inciting ethnic-based violence and discrimination against the Amhara. The violations amount to gross violation of human rights, serious violation of *International Humanitarian Law* (IHL) and *International Criminal Law* (ICL).

Introduction

Contrary to principles of genuine federalism, a divisive ethnic federalism was imposed and constitutionalized in the Ethiopian political landscape in 1991 by the *Tigray People's Liberation Front* (TPLF) and the *Oromo Liberation Front* (OLF) after overthrowing the Derg regime. Driven by extreme anti-Amhara sentiments, the ethnic system is apartheid-like exposing the Amhara, taken as an enemy, to decades-long abuses. Since then, the Amhara have suffered an increasing and unimaginable persecution, forced

displacement in the millions, mass killings and its livelihood destroyed in many parts of the country mainly in its ancestral lands of Welkait, Raya, Metekel, Dera and throughout the Benishangul-Gumuz and Oromia Regions where the Amhara are considered as settlers and non-owner of the lands in their own country. Since the 2018 power shift from TPLF to the *Oromo Prosperity Party* (OPP), the persecution and deadly violence against the Amhara people have increased both in scale and frequency even in Addis Ababa city and Amhara Region where is the Amhara are the majority but are subject to discriminatory policies. The Abiy regime forces not only refused to protect the Amhara from violent armed groups such as the OLA and TPLF, they have enabled such actors and in many instances have been complicit with them and independently carried out attacks against the Amhara civilians.

To protect the unabated abuses on the Amhara people, Fano fighters groups have taken up arms reinforced by contingents of the *Amhara Special Force* (ASF). These two forces were able to protect their people by defending against successive invasions by OLA and TPLF into the Amhara Region since 2021. While the apartheid-like system is still functioning, the Amhara persecution by both state and non-state actors has continued unabated and both the TPLF and OLA continue to threaten the security of the Amhara. The Abiy regime dissolved the ASF and attempted to disarm Fano fighters in early April 2023. This action led to popular protests in all towns of the region. In response to the protests, the Abiy-led federal authority declared a war the same month to disarm the Amhara people. The first stage of the war ended in last days of July 2023 when Fano fighters were able to push the regime forces out of major cities of the Amhara Region.

In August 3, 2023, the federal government declared a state of emergency and began a full-blown war with all kinds of weapons including heavy artillery and war drones opened indiscriminate attacks on both the armed Fano fighters and unarmed Amhara civilians.

This report thus covers widespread gross human rights and serious international humanitarian law violations, mass killings, extra-judicial executions, bodily injuries, rape and other forms of sexual violence, mass arrest and ethnic profiling, internal displacement and property pillaging, looting and destruction across the Amhara Region and Addis Ababa in the context of the war by the regime forces for the two months since the declaration of the state of emergency in August 3rd up to October 3rd, 2023.

The Gross Human Rights and International Humanitarian Laws Violations

Mass Killing and Bodily Injury

According to AAA's investigation at least 807 Amhara civilians were killed and 634 were injured in 11 zones and city administrations of the Amhara Region by primarily ENDF soldiers since the start of the state of emergency. Most of the casualties were perpetrated in the form of at least 40 massacre incidents whereas the rest occurred in several sporadic incidents. Below is a breakdown of killings and bodily injuries across the seven zones and a list of known massacre incidents.

Incidences of killing and bodily injury in the context of the ongoing war on Amhara involved killings executed with gunshots or throats slit being accused of hiding firearms, violating curfew, collaborating with and/or being Fano fighters or being shelled with heavy artillery.

Execution-style killings and injuries

Most of the mass killings, extrajudicial killings and injury cases are execution-style where victims were attacked with knives, gunshots and burning being accused of being a member or collaborator of the Fano fighters, in retaliation for losses on the battlefield with Fano fighters and violating curfew. One such incident occurred on August 28, 2023 when the ENDF executed at least 13 Amhara youths including Shitaw, Esayas, Messay and Mamo with gunshot accusing them of being or supporting Fano in Lemi town of Ensaro Woreda (North Shewa Zone, Amhara Region). Similarly, on September 25, 2025, the ENDF soldiers went house-to-house and massacred 9 Amhara farmers with gunshots including Amare Asmamaw Yigzaw (42-year-old), Mulaw Shibabaw Admassie (39-year-old), Getahun Mandefro Dessie (37-year-old), Setegn Shigutie Zeleke (47-year-old) and Gobaw Mesfin in Chinchaye Kebele, Gonder Zuriya Woreda, Central

Gonder Zone accused them of collaborating with and feeding Fano fighters.

Between October 2 and 3, 2023, the OLA massacred 78 Amhara villagers including elderly persons like 74-year-old Shitaw Wubie, children like Solomon Wubie and dozens of women and injured 9 others in addition to extensive pillaging and destructions in 4 Kebeles of Dera Woreda, North Shewa Zone (Oromia Region). Most of the victims of this incident were attacked with gunshots using rifles and heavy machineguns while some victims were killed by other methods, including their throats being slit and being burned alive. Among the victims was Zebider Sebsibe who was killed by having her throat slit and Emey Bekele was burned alive inside her home. The attack was launched after they accused villagers of hosting and supporting Fano fighters.

In some occasions, ENDF extra-judicially killed and injured civilians with gunshots for mere reason of violating curfew. Among such incidents, on September 28, 2023, at 7:30 five civilians, four of them from a single family, were 30 minutes late to return home from Motta town where a woman was receiving medical treatment, and they were shot to death when returning to Gindewoyn town (East Gojjam Zone). Two of the victims were women one of whom was sick at the time and was receiving medical treatment in Motta town. In another incident which occurred on September 13, 2023, ENDF shot and killed 2 youths and injured 3 others in the Shembeko neighborhood of Mekaneselem town (South Wollo Zone) accusing them of violating curfew. The regime soldiers opened fire on the victims at around 7:10 pm as they were traveling home on 2 bajaj vehicles (three-wheeled autorickshaw). The victims were traveling 10 minutes past the curfew of 7:00 pm. The deceased victims were identified as Mikiyas Begashaw, a 5th year medical student at Bahir Dar University and Wubeshet Gebe (a driver of one of the bajajs). One of the injured victims was identified as Nibret Hailu. Similarly, on September 22, 2023, at around 5:20 am, in Majete town of Efratana Gidim Woreda (North Shewa Zone, Amhara

Region) the regime troops shot a civilian named Kassahun Bekele Demissie on the left side of his waist accusing him of moving in the town outside of curfew. He was severely injured and referred to Dessie General Hospital with little hope of survival.

AAA has also verified that wounded Fano fighters were deliberately killed from denial of and termination of medical assistance. Among such incidents, a Fano member by name of Molla Melaku was injured on September 22, 2023, in fighting with ENDF in an area called Doro Gibir near Woldia town, administrative capital of North Wollo Zone.

Following the injury, he was brought to Woldia Hospital for medical assistance. On September 24 while he was in an operation room receiving care, ENDF soldiers entered the hospital and took him away by force after terminating the medical assistance. He was killed the same day while being kept in Woldia Stadium, which was transformed to a military camp by the ENDF. There were also other instances of Fano fighters suffering the same fate of dying after deliberate termination of their medical care by ENDF soldiers in Gonder and recently Bahir Dar Hospitals.

Massacres in a combined form of execution and shelling

In a significant number of the incidents, the attacks are a combination of both execution-style killings and shelling. On September 3, 2023 an attack on Majete town claimed the lives of at least 33 civilians and left 14 others injured, 28 civilians were deliberately shot to death, 22 killed and 13 injured by ENDF and 6 were killed by OLA in the assailants' house-to-house search in Majete town of Efratana Gidim Woreda (North Shewa Zone, Amhara Region). It was in response to Fano fighters' sudden attack on ENDF the victims were accused of collaborating and being Fano fighters. In the same incident, the ENDF fired heavy artillery shells that hit residential houses in the town and the surrounding Alga village resulted in the deaths of 5 civilians including women and a 4-year-old child, and injured another woman. On August 7, 2023, ENDF killed a total of 6

civilians including women and injured 2 others in Kulmesk town in Lasta Woreda (North Wollo Zone). Five of the killed victims were executed by gunshots being accused of hosting, collaborating with and being Fano fighters. Between August 4 and 10, 2023, the ENDF committed a large-scale massacre in Bahir Dar city where over 140 civilians including women, children (like 6-month-old Ammanuel Dessie) and elderly persons were killed and 270 were gravely and moderately injured including 33 women, 5 children and 5 elderly persons. Most of victims were deliberately shot with light arms and heavy machineguns in between or after fighting with Fano, in house-to-house searches, while moving in streets and residential compounds while some of the victims were killed after being hit by heavy artillery shells from ENDF. At least two rounds of massacres by ENDF were also verified from Debre Markos town, the capital of East Gojjam Zone. The first occurred between August 25 and 27, 2023, when at least 20 people were reportedly killed and scores of others injured (some estimates placed the figure in the hundreds).¹ During the second round between September 17 and 20, 2023 immense civilian deaths and injury by ENDF's execution and shelling were reported though AAA was only able to verify 14 deaths due to regime communication blackout.

Drone Strikes

AAA has recorded at least 6 deadly drone strikes between August and September 2023 that resulted in civilian casualties, brutal deaths and severe injuries. The deadliest one occurred on August 13, 2023, in Finote Selam town, capital of West Gojjam Zone, where at least 30 civilians were killed and more than 50 were severely injured after a drone strike in a densely populated area of the town, where neither active fighting was taking place or Fano fighters existed. Additionally, on September 17, 2023, the ENDF carried out at least two deadly drone strikes in Dembecha town (West Gojjam Zone). One was carried out near St. Michael's Church in the town, where at least 18 people were reportedly killed

and several others injured. The same day, in a place called Wesfie-Dingay (Abraham Mountains) in Quarit Woreda (West Gojjam Zone) at least 20 civilians were killed and over 50 injured in two separate drone strikes. The fifth drone strike was committed on September 3, 2023, in a place called Woyn-Wuha in Dega-Damot Woreda (West Gojjam Zone) which resulted in the deaths of 8 civilians including 4 women. Another drone strike was also carried out in Debre Birhan town, capital of North Shewa Zone (Amhara Region) which resulted in the death and injury of an unspecified number of people.

Human Rights Organizations Report on the Killings and Bodily Injuries

Consistent with AAA's findings, international and local rights bodies reported killing and indiscriminate attacks on civilians in the context of the ongoing conflict in the Amhara Region. The *United Nations Office of Higher Commissioner for Human Rights* (UNOHCHR) reported that at least 183 civilians were killed in the context of the conflict between Fano fighters and the ENDF since last July.² The Association for *Human Rights in Ethiopia* (AHRE) also expressed its concern over civilian deaths, property destruction and other human rights violations citing several deadly incidents including the August 12 drone strike and the August 13 shelling in Finote Selam town (West Gojjam Zone).³ The *Ethiopian Human Rights Council* (EHRCO) on its part reported several human rights violations including killings in several cities of the Amhara Region in the context of the ongoing conflict.⁴ The NHRI in the country, the *Ethiopian Human Rights Commission* (EHRC) found that there was heavy fighting in and around cities and towns across the Amhara Region, which involved the use of heavy artillery resulting in the deaths and injuries of civilians, as well as damage to property.⁵ The commission specifically raised

the incident of how residents and workers were killed and civilian infrastructures were hit by fragments of heavy artillery in Debre Birhan city between August 6 and 7, 2023. It is known only ENDF has heavy artillery among the conflicting parties. In its latest press statement, the commission expressed its serious concern on widespread extrajudicial killings in the context of the ongoing conflict in the region as:

“Extrajudicial killings by the government security forces in several locations in context of the conflict are seriously concerning. For instance, from July 31 to September 10, 2023, persons found in house-to house searches, those found in streets and unarmed during hostilities, those asked to bring firearms they accused of hiding it, those who found violating curfew, member of the militias (Fano) who were taken prisoner were among victims killed in widespread campaign of extrajudicial killings in Adet, Debre Markos, Debre Tabor, Lemmi, Jiga, Majete, Merawi, Mertolemariam and Shewa Robit towns.”

On August 9, 2023, the Human Rights Watch issued a dispatch entitled the “*Deepening Crisis in Ethiopia’s Amhara Region*”.⁶ On September 12, 2023, Access Now and the #KeepItOn coalition issued a joint statement alongside 44 civic organizations including AAA and the Amhara Professionals Union (APU).⁷ The Lemkin Institute for Genocide Prevention also issued an active genocide alert regarding the situation in Amhara Region on September 23rd, 2023.⁸

Rape and Other Forms of Sexual Violence

AAA has received various reports of *sexual and gender-based violence (SGBV)*, rape, and gang rape by ENDF in the Amhara Region in contexts of the ongoing armed conflict though it has not been possible to verify this due to the complete communications blackout in the majority of the region. Among such incidents, on September 10, 2023, the regime forces attempted rape on a woman by the first name of Yeshitila. On the same date in another place, the troops beat a woman and raped the other while they were making coffee at Zemu building (in the town). The soldiers also robbed 600 birr from the victims. The residents taken the case to the leaders of the troops, but they did not provide any solution or do justice.

Mass Detention and Ethnic Profiling of the Amhara

AAA has also verified since August 3, 2023, ENDF and other security forces began mass arrests and ethnic profiling of tens of thousands of ethnic Amharas in Amhara Region and Addis Ababa city. Victims of the mass arrests included journalists, opposition political figures including members of parliament with parliamentary immunity, doctors,

daily laborers and young children on the streets. The arrests were mass in scale and arbitrary in nature including individuals in possession of identification cards listing their Amhara identity, individuals without identification cards, and groups of people were arrested en masse and detained in inhuman and deplorable conditions in concentration camps, military training camps and other unacknowledged sites.

Politicians and Journalists

Detained Amhara politicians include elected representatives including Christian Tadele, a member of the *House of Peoples' Representatives* (HOPR), the national lower house and Dr. Kassa Teshager, a member of the Addis Ababa city council who has parliamentary immunity under the constitution were abducted at a legally forbidden time, on the night of August 4, 2023. Christian Tadele is a former executive official of opposition party, *National Movement of Amhara* (NaMA) leader who once called upon the prime minister to resign from power in a parliamentary sessions.⁹ Even though he is a member of the ruling political party, Dr. Kassa Teshager often forwards critics on Abiy government over its refusal to stop ethnic-based attacks on the Amhara people and calls the people to resist.¹⁰ Another prominent Amhara politician, Yohannes Buayalew who has constitutional immunity by being a member of the Amhara Regional Council and the House of Federation was abducted by the regime security forces from his home in Bahir Dar city. Yohannes was former head of the Amhara Prosperity Party later became critical of the Abiy regime's mismanagement of the country and repression of the Amhara people. Weeks before his arrest, he criticized Abiy's government as "*the government of parks*" accusing it of focusing on constructing extravagant castles and parks rather than supplying resources for Amhara farmers who have suffered with acute lack of fertilizer.¹¹ Arresting these three persons with parliamentary immunity without withholding their immunity by

the council/house they are members of is blatantly unconstitutional demonstrating the undermined status of the rule of law and constitutionalism in the country. Many more politicians including four members of Balderas for True Democracy (Balderas) party and one of the party's senior leaders, Sintayehu Chekol are detained at concentration camps.¹²

Amhara journalists have been also hunted down. Abay Zewdu, a journalist at Amhara Media Center was also arrested on August 10, 2023, on his way home. Another journalist, Bekalu Alamrew, owner of Alpha Media was arrested earlier on August 6, 2023, in Addis Ababa city. On August 25, 2023, Fekadu Mahtemework, owner of Ghion Magazine, the only weekly magazine in the country, was arrested by security forces at night at his home in Addis Ababa. The security forces also confiscated copies of the magazine that were to be distributed. According to his wife, Meron Jembere, journalist Yehualashet Zerihun, program director of Tirit FM 97.6 was arrested on September 11, 2023, by federal police at his home located in Balderas Condominiums, Addis Ababa. He is yet to be brought before a court firstly detained at the Federal Criminal Investigations Office located around Mexico square in Addis Ababa city. Now he is taken to Awash Arba military camp, an unacknowledged detention site.

Physical Assaults at the Time of Arrest and Due Procedural Rights Violations

The detained victims were physically assaulted at the time of their arrests. According to the families of one of the detainees, Christian Tadele, he asked his arresters “*I am a lawful person. What do you want from me?*” and one of the arresting police officers proceed to punch him. Balderas Party officially announced to the public that its two detained members, Kurabachew Gebrie and Belete Getnet were severely beaten while under detention in Awash Arba military camp. Yeshiwork Alemu, the mother of Kurabachew, told the party that he was in critical condition after the abuse until he was brought by the Red Cross to Addis Ababa to help him receive medical care. Belete Getnet is also seriously injured on his fingers and cannot move. Due to a shortage of Ambulances, the Red Cross medical crew cannot bring him to Addis Ababa for medical treatment at least for the time being. Some of the detainees told the EHRC that at the time of their arrest and their houses being searched, they and their families experienced beating, ethnic slurs, harassment, intimidation and threats.¹³

Beyond the physical abuses such as the above-mentioned ones, the Amhara detainees’ due procedural rights are also being flagrantly violated. Almost all the Amhara detainees are yet to be brought before a court, not told the reason for their arrest, denied visitation by their families, lawyers and detained incommunicado, and detained in unlawful sites, Awash Arba military camp under substandard conditions. The EHRCO stated about such violations as “*the arrest. . . violates procedural rules; some of the detainees’ whereabouts are not known, the list and whereabouts of detainees are not uncovered and detainees are not yet brought before courts.*” The council also concluded that some of the detention cases have the characteristics of forcible disappearance as the exact whereabouts of many detainees including parliament members are yet to be known and the government is not

willing to reveal. The EHRC opined that the state of emergency in place cannot be a defense for denying detainees' right to be visited by families, not to be detained in unacknowledged detention sites like Awash Arba military camp and the right to be brought before courts.

Unacknowledged Detention Sites and Concentration Camps

Many of the victims of the mass arrests in Addis Ababa were primarily kept in unfinished buildings, warehouses, police stations and in public schools including in the Dejazmach Wondyirad School (Yeka sub-city, Kotebe area), Omer Semester Secondary School (Addis Ketema), Kokebe Tsibah (Yeka sub-city, around Megenagna), Abado primary (Yeka sub-city, in Abado condominium), Mission police station and Ayer Tena Secondary schools. While some of the victims were eventually released, most of the victims were taken to concentration camps located in Sheger city and military training camps at Awash Arba (Afar Region) and the south police training camp located in Asobo, both of which are unacknowledged detention sites. Prominent politicians and journalists including Christian Tadele, Yohannes Bualew and Abay Zewdu are detained at the Awash Arba camp. It is confirmed that over 10,000 ethnic Amharas, mainly youths are concentrated in several concentration camps located in Gelan and Tulu Dimtu sub-cities of Sheger city, where detainees have died on a daily basis from infection by communicable diseases such as cholera. Selamawit Girmachew, Central and Northern Regional Monitoring and Investigation Director at the EHRC told Tikvah-Ethiopia that there were over 4,000 detainees in a concentration camp located in Sidamo Awash Woreda of Gelan sub-city of Sheger city.¹⁴ She also confirmed that an endemic occurred in the camp and resulted in deaths of several inmates.

Victims from the Amhara Region have been detained in police stations and sites ENDF encamped for some time, and eventually taken to be detained incommunicado in Baker military camp, located in the Welkait Tegede Setit Humera Zone of Amhara Region including the abovementioned sites and other unacknowledged sites located in Shewa Robit (North Shewa Zone, Amhara Region) and Kombolcha towns (South Wollo Zone, Amhara Region). The victims are impoverished and in crowded camps with no supply

from the government. They have no space, let alone mattresses or chairs to sleep or sit.

Rights Bodies Reports and EOTC Press Releases

The *National Human Rights Institution* (NHRI), EHRC, International Human Rights Organizations and local NGOs have also confirmed the ethnic-based mass arrests of ethnic Amharas which is consistent with AAA’s findings. The EHRC, in its recent report, reaffirmed the ethnically motivated mass arrests of ethnic Amharas in Addis Ababa saying, “*In Addis Ababa city administration, there has been widespread arrest of civilians who are of ethnic Amhara origin.*”¹⁵ The commission has also revealed that the regime denied it to visit and monitor the concentration camps where ethnic Amharas are held in deplorable conditions. The UNOHCHR, in its latest report covered the ethnic-based mass arrest as “*We have received reports that more than 1,000 people have been arrested across Ethiopia under this law. Many of those detained were reported to be young people of Amhara ethnic origin suspected of being Fano supporters.*”¹⁶ It also mentioned that arrest victims were kept in improvised sites “*Detainees have reportedly been placed in improvised detention centers that lack basic amenities.*” Well-known local rights NGO, EHRCO, in its Amharic report, mentioned the ethnic-based mass arrest in Addis Ababa as “*since the state of emergency was declared (August 4, 2023), extensive mass arrests have taken place in Addis Ababa.*”¹⁷ The EHRCO also reported that authorities refused to reply to a letter from it requesting them to reveal the whereabouts of victims of the mass arrests. Religious institutions including the *Ethiopian Orthodox Tewahedo Church* (EOTC) are also raising concerns over the ethnic-based mass arrest and detainment in concentration camps. Bahir Dar and surrounding Diocese Bishop and Secretariat of the Patriarchy, Abune Abraham spoke in one of the church’s press releases saying “*time and time again*

we are witnessing the fanning of grudges and hatred just like what happened during the Tigray war yesterday, and today the labeling has targeted the Amhara community who are being thrown into concentration camps, the suffering shall come to an end.”¹⁸ ¹⁹

Pillaging and Destruction of Property

AAA verified that mainly ENDF and in some incidents OLA engaged in widespread property pillaging, looting and destruction in the Amhara Region and Dera Woreda (North Shewa Zone, Oromia Region) where the ongoing conflict has taken place. Most of the destruction occurred on residential houses, health institutions including hospitals and other structures when ENDF indiscriminately shelled villages and towns whereas in some incidents the perpetrators deliberately burned down villages and houses. The perpetrators also looted articles including necklaces, mobile phones and cash, and looted cattle and homes on a large scale. Among such incidents, on August 17th, 2023 during the Kulmesk massacre, ENDF soldiers conducted house-to-house searches, robbing 3 legally owned firearms, 12 mobile phones and thousands (ETB) in cash belonging to 12 residents of the town. During the September 3rd, 2023 Majete massacre, the OLA militants looted 27 cattle and movable articles inside 13 houses in Marmid village surrounding Majete town. In the same incident, the ENDF struck and destroyed 3 houses belonging to three farmers. The victims included the late Kemaw Kibret who was killed with his 2 children in the shelling, Aselef Asegid, whose daughter was injured in the shelling, and Abush Molla. In the October 2nd and 3rd, 2023 Dera massacre, the OLA militants and allied Qeerro (an extremist Oromo vigilant youth group) looted 550 cattle and other movable properties and deliberately burned over 100 houses and other structures belonging to Amhara villagers in Dagnu and Koro Kebeles of Dera Woreda (North Shewa Zone, Oromia Region). Between September 17th and 18th, 2023, forced displacement of

Amhara residents and annexation of Amhara land occurred in Awra Godana town (North Shewa Zone, Amhara Region), where all kinds of properties belonging to all households estimated above 1,000 were all looted and ransacked by the OSF and Qeerro.

Annexation of Awra Godana town of Amhara Region and Forced Displacement of Amhara Residents

AAA has also verified that the *Oromia Special Forces* (OSF) assisted by the Oromo-dominated ENDF annexed Awra Godana town in Amora Bet Kebele of Minjar Shenkora Woreda (North Shewa Zone, Amhara Region). The town is inhabited by ethnic Amharas and strategically important due to its location along the Ethio-Djibouti road. According to residents, the OSF opened fire on residents on September 17, 2023. After learning that local farmers had successfully mounted self-defense against the OSF, the Oromo-dominated ENDF assisted the latter by shelling the farmers with heavy artillery.

Following the joint attack by the OSF and ENDF, more than 1,000 Amhara households comprising close to 3,500 members of the town fled to the neighboring Melka Jilo Kebele located in the same woreda knowing the then advancing OSF assisted by ENDF would not spare any one of them. The displaced victims are yet to receive any aid whatsoever and remain in dire conditions without shelter, food and other necessities. The only remaining people in the town were five in number. Two of them were named Faki Ahmed (31-years-old) and Atilaw Abebe (36-years-old) both of whom were killed by OSF. The third was an immobile elderly woman who was killed by OSF inside her home. The fourth was a mentally disabled person named Mensur who was shot by the OSF but whether he died is yet to be known. The fifth was a priest unknown by name who was also shot by the OSF and his fate is unknown too.

After the large-scale displacement of the residents, the OSF entered the town on

September 18, 2023, and killed all five remaining residents. The OSF and the Qerroo committed industrial-scale pillaging and looting of the town and destruction of the livelihood of residents in case they managed to return. Thousands of houses and businesses in the town were destroyed, properties inside including grains, cash and household utilities were all looted and vandalized. The motive behind the brutality is genocidal and an extension of the ongoing Amhara genocidal designed by the OPP-led government to exclusively own the Ethio-Djibouti highway by forcibly expelling Amharas inhabiting it and exclusively owning all areas around it. On September 18, 2023, the Oromo Regional Government declared the town belongs to the Oromia Regional State. On the same date, the Oromo administration removed the old banner which indicated the areas was under the Amhara Region administration and replaced with a new one stating the town is under the administration of Fentale Woreda in East Shewa Zone under the Oromia Regional State. The Oromia Region security forces renamed the town *Korke*, an Afan Oromo name.

Communication Blackout

Both telecommunications companies, the fully state controlled *Ethio-telecom* and the private one, *Safaricom* Ethiopia shutdown both internet and mobile phone services throughout the Amhara Region. The action was deliberately ordered by the regime to indiscriminately attack the Amhara people and go on with the gross violations in silence, to hinder media and human rights investigations into the ongoing abuses. Mobile data is still shutdown since the last days of July 2023 when the Fano fighters made advances whereas network was shut down around mid September when Fano fighters managed to control several towns in the Gojjam Zones including in Bure, Finote Selam and Debre Markos again. Since mid-September up to October 8, 2023, all of North Shewa Zone except Debre Birhan town, all western woredas of South Wollo Zone, all areas of North Wollo Zone except Woldia town, the entire Gojjam Zones except Injibara and Bahir Dar

towns, all Gonder zones except zonal towns were deliberately placed under blackout. After October 8, 2023, mobile network services have been occasionally working in some areas while it has remained closed in most Gojjam areas. This blackout has hindered investigations on the situation and enabled the regime to go on with abuses in silence, affecting familial communications, economic, educational and research activities in the region.

Incitement to Violence, Hostility and Discrimination

Examining several electronic and video documents, AAA has confirmed that government officials and their allies, both in the form of public speeches and artistic works are disseminating very dangerous messages that incite discrimination, enmity and violence against the Amhara people. Before and after the start of the ongoing war on the Amhara, there were common coded-derogatory terms to insult and humiliate the Amhara and to trigger violence against them including “neftegna”, “settler”, “chauvinist”, and “old system supporter”. More recently, especially when the ongoing war begun, the use of such derogatory terms increased. Since August 4, 2023, the social affairs advisor of the Prime Minister, Daniel Kibret coined derogatory terms such as “jawesa”, “cat” and “porcupine” which were widely used to dehumanize the Amhara population and justify the ongoing abuses by government forces. On August 22, 2023, the Oromia Region President, Shimelis Abdisa incited the interim Tigray authorities to join the ongoing war and abuse on the Amhara through its representative as *“The fight we began now is decisive. At this time, the Fano, who are advocating for one religion, one country, and one language, want to rule by force and be superior, are coming for us. We are at a stage the Tigray and Oromo people will join hands to fight this.”*²⁰ In Horo Guduru Wollega Zone, a high commander of the regime forces incited a large gathering of the Oromo youth against Amhara minorities in the zone and blamed them being late to fight the local Amhara as

“let’s hear each other. Let’s speak the truth. What were you doing when Fano took over this area? Were you born today? What are you talking about? It is now the third year since Fano reached the Oromia land.”²¹ On October 9, 2023, in Bishoftu (Debre Zeyit) town, at the time of Ireecha celebrations a crowd of ultranationalist Oromo endorsed the Abiy regime’s war on Amharas and incited genocidal violence against Amharas residing in Oromia Region as “For those of you living in Oromia, if you don’t condemn the action of Fano, Eskindir and Zemene Kassie (Fano leaders), things will be worse on you. Addis Ababa belongs to Oromo. Amhara people who live in Adama, Sebeta, Burayu, Sululuta and Bishoftu think for yourself.”²²

The same is also true in the artistic sphere. Oromo musicians are increasingly inciting their Oromo audience against the Amhara and humiliating the Amhara. Eskindir Tamiru in his single album *SHILLALAA SHII* released in 2022 insults the Amhara people by saying “you Demelashi [euphemism for Amhara]. What do you know except Shilela? [traditional Amhara patriotic song]”²³ Another Oromo artist, Daba Chala in his 2023 single album, *Yaa Baala Foxxa* incited the Oromo public and threatened the Amhara saying “you wearer of Fota [a traditional Amhara towel] what do you know except Shilela. Hide yourself the great Oromo people are coming for you.”²⁴ A third artist, Andualem Gossa also called for the full expulsion of the Amhara from the capital, Addis Ababa in his single album *Darbee Laalla*.²⁵ A fourth Artist, Yosan Getahun in his famous *Bulloo* single album incited the Oromo public to cut ties with the “Northerners” (Amhara and Tigray people).²⁶

Legal Analysis

The above discussed abuses in the context of the ongoing armed conflict are gross violations of human rights and IHL as well as the ICL. The mass and extrajudicial killings as well as injury of civilians and hors de combat by ENDF, OLA and OSF are gross violations of the right to life and the right to security of person recognized under the *International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights* (ICCPR) and General Comment 31 of the UN Human Rights Committee. The violation is gross because any arbitrary deprivation of life by state agents (ENDF and OSF) constitutes gross violations and the scale of the killing by OLA is large enough to be considered as crime against humanity which is a gross violation. The ENDF also violated the right to protection from torture and other cruel, inhuman and degrading treatments or punishment as defined under ICCPR and the *Torture Convention* (CAT) by perpetrating rape which is torture by itself. The property destruction including burning of houses and pillaging as well as the forced displacement in violation of the right to property, the right to house and protection against forced eviction and the right to residence as firmly recognized under international human rights law. The mass detention including at concentration camps by government security forces across Addis Ababa and the Amhara Region is also a gross violation of the right to liberty and security of persons as defined under the ICCPR. The government officials' and Oromo artists' incitement for discrimination, hostility and violence against the Amhara community and the selective nature of the violations targeting ethnic Amharas are a violation of the principle of non-discrimination recognized under the international law including the ICCPR, *Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination* (CERD), and the 2012 Rabat Plan of Action on the Prohibition of Advocacy of National, Racial or Religious Hatred. The violations could not be justified by the state of emergency declared on August 3, 2023, because violations on the right to life, protection against torture and equality and non-discrimination are always non-derogable even in times of such emergency declarations whereas the rest of the violations including

the mass arrest, property destruction and displacement were committed in violation of the principle of necessity and proportionality the government forces should have complied with. The communication blackout is amounting to violation of the right to freedom of press, the right to information and other multiple human rights.

Customary IHL, Common Article 3 of the 1949 Geneva Convention and protocol II of the Geneva Convention all applicable to the ongoing *Non-International Armed Conflict* (NIAC) in the Amhara Region prohibit directing attacks against civilian population and objectives, violence to life and person and outrages upon personal dignity including rape, and requires distinguishing civilian and military objectives during hostilities and protection of civilians and wounded, sick and shipwrecked members of the armed forces who have ceased to take part in the hostilities. The acts of ENDF and OLA including mass and extrajudicial killing of civilian and hors de combat and wounded combatants, widespread bodily injury, destruction of civilian objectives including civilian infrastructures, houses and lootings by gunshots, drone strikes and shelling and rape in the context of the ongoing war on Amhara violates *International Humanitarian Law* (IHL) as defined here.

The serious human rights and IHL violations amount to international crimes including war crimes and crime against humanity as defined in the Rome Statute of International Criminal Court and the Customary International Criminal Law. The IHL violations including the mass killings, extrajudicial killings, rape, destruction and pillaging of properties amounting to war crimes as they have nexus with the ongoing armed conflict in the Amhara Region. The violence was perpetrated after many victims were accused of being Fano, supporting Fano and hiding firearms they used to fight ENDF and in retaliation for loss. The violations including the mass killings, forced displacement, mass detentions in concentration camps by ENDF and other government security forces and

OLA are crimes against humanity of murder, forcible population transfer, persecution, imprisonment or other severe deprivation of physical liberty, and acts causing greater suffering or serious injury to body or to mental or physical health. Because the violations are both widespread, large in scale and victimize hundreds and systematic, sufficiently organized as part of a pattern of number of violence committed in all areas the Amhara Region and Dera Woreda (North Shewa Zone, Oromia Region) where the war has taken place. The violations are also an extension of the already established Amhara genocide in the past couples of decades.
