

Abductions and Killings of ethnic Amhara civilians by the Oromo Liberation Army in East Wollega and Horo Gurudu Wollega Zones of Oromia Region from August 28 to September 29, 2021

The Amhara Association of America (AAA) continues to document the ongoing human rights abuses and atrocities committed by suspected militias of the Oromo Liberation Army (OLA) against ethnic Amhara civilians in the Misraq (East) Wollega and Horo Guduru Wollega Zones¹ of Ethiopia's Oromia Region. Between August 28, and September 29, 2021, AAA documented 9 incidents which resulted in 17 dead, 17 abductions (majority assumed dead or unaccounted for) and 7 injured (with some suffering life threatening injuries).

On August 28th, 2021, in Libo Kebele (ward/precinct) of Sibu Sire Woreda (district), a district in East Wollega Zone, an ethnic Amhara by the name of Abebe Ashagrey, was abducted mid-day while returning home from a local market and later killed by OLA militias.

On August 29th, 2021, AAA documented two abduction cases, one in East Wollega Zone and one in Horo Guduru Wollega Zone. At around 11 am, an ethnic Amhara farmer by the name of Sheah Seayd Mehdi was abducted by gunmen thought to be OLA militias in Lelistu

Kebele, Mercato town of Sibu Sire Woreda in East Wollega Zone. The militias kidnapped the victim along with his seven cattle. In a separate incident, at around 5:30 pm that afternoon, OLA abducted three people and wounded two others in a raid in Begi village, Gorte Kebele, Abe Dongoro Woreda of Horo Guduru Wollega Zone. Sources from the ground told AAA that the five victims were tending to their cattle when they were cornered and targeted by a group of OLA militias. Upon their arrival, the militias shot at one of the victims by the name of Beshir Hassen twice and abandoned him, assuming he was dead. Thereafter, they beat the remaining victims savagely and subsequently took them at gunpoint into the bush. However, one of them, Kindu Ali, managed to escape. It was said that the kidnappers asked the victims' families for a ransom of 300,000 ETB to release the remaining three abductees.

On September 4th, 2021, OLA militias abducted five Amharas in Tinishr village, Haro Kebele of Kiremu Woreda in East Wollega Zone. The militias were said to have freed the victims later that day following negotiation that involved local elders, officials and OLA militias. The victims were as follows:

On September 5th, 2021, five ethnic Amhara residents were abducted in the Gida Woreda of East Wollega Zone of the Oromia Region by militias of the OLA. Even though their fate and whereabouts remain unknown to date, they are generally assumed to have been killed by the militias.

On September 7th, 2021, an ethnic Amhara named Shumye Arega was abducted by OLA militias in Wedesa Dima Kebele of Kiremu Woreda, East Wollega Zone. Shumye was said to have gone to his farm in a remote village when the militias stormed the farm and abducted him.

On September 8th, 2021, OLA militias kidnapped an Amhara farmer by the name of Hassen Munye. He was abducted from his farm in Qoye village, Boka (aka Buqa Suruma) Kebele of Kiremu Woreda, East Wollega Zone.

On September 16th, 2021, at least thirteen ethnic Amhara IDPs, including eight women, were killed and five others injured in Kiremu Woreda, East Wollega Zone ². The victims were killed and wounded after they had been abducted by OLA. According to AAA's investigation, the IDPs were whisked away by OLA militias from Laften village, Boka Kebele, Kiremu Woreda, East Wollega Zone at around 8 a.m. local time when they were returning to their homes from Kiremu 01, hoping the security situation had improved. One day later, on September 17th, 2021, the remains of 12 of the victims were found in a home in Laften Village, according to AAA sources. Some of the victims were beheaded, chopped to pieces, and then

burned, leaving parts of their bodies not only charred but also deformed in various ways. Five of the abductees were also found inside another nearby house in critical condition and one died of her injury days later.

On September 29th, 2021, in a village in Ejere Kebele of Gida Woreda, OLA militias killed four ethnic Amharas of the same family. Sources told AAA that the militias stopped a public minibus heading from Gida to Kiremu, when it reached Yejere Kebele, and dragged away four of the passengers into the surrounding woods, which is controlled by OLA, and the victims were found dead with throat slit a day after. The victims were returning from Gida Hospital
